Sports are important for teaching the importance of strategy, planning, and working on techniques. Professional players practice constantly to improve their abilities so they can excel in their craft.



It may look like I'm golfing, fishing, or just on a walk, but in reality, I am working, searching for inspiration. I'll even go and paint plein air at the golf course, just as long as I stay out of the way of the golfers!

What is your favorite thing about being an artist?

The experience of constantly learning...be it learning about the subject matter or the endless methods and techniques of painting with watercolors, acrylics, or oils. In landscapes and seascapes, focusing on the subject, seeing the important things and editing out those elements that detract from the story. Improving my brush techniques and allowing the paints to do what they do and not be afraid of happy accidents. Letting go and trusting the process. In illustration and design, continually learning how to tell a story visually while expanding my techniques and skills. I enjoy that it is a never-ending learning process rooted in storytelling

If time and money were no object, what is one thing that you would like to do?


Pack things up and move to a little beach town where I can paint landscapes and seascapes and create coastal designs all day, every day and never shovel snow ever again.

Last time you went shopping what stood out to you?


